On Tuesday, September 26, 2023, around 7:30 pm, Fritz Heilingbrunner slipped peacefully into the deeper sleep of death.

He was beloved by many, most especially by his wife of 72 years, Valentine, and his children - Katharina, Frick (Deborah), Andrea, Suzanne (Gary), Richard (Paula), grandchildren - Melissa (Domenic), Nicola, great-grandchildren - Aiden, Hudson, sister - Inge (Ingo), and brother - Otto-deceased (Hanna-deceased). He will also be missed by step-grandchildren - Stephen, Jennifer - as well as nieces and nephews. There are many others who can also attest to his positive influence in their lives, and who called him "friend".

He was well-known and will be remembered in the community. He had been an enthusiastic member of the Peterborough Nature Club, and loved to hike in the woods right into his old age. Some will remember him for his love of almost anything that flew; his great-grandson boasted that "Gramps could identify an airplane just from the sound of it in the sky - he didn't even have to see it". He was always keenly interested in geology and throughout his life was a dedicated "rock hound". Many of his students from his time as a teacher

at Sir Sandford Fleming College still remember him fondly. But Fritz would like most to be remembered for his tireless efforts in his ministry work.

Fritz was firmly convinced that his death would be only a temporary situation. He did not fear it. He knew from years of careful study of the scriptures that he would be reunited with his family once again here on an earth brought to perfection when God's will is done on earth (as in heaven) through His Kingdom. This hope is the same hope held by faithful ones mentioned throughout the scriptures, that Jesus preached, and that all faithful Christians have believed from the first century until now. This is the hope that Fritz shared with whomever would listen. While not taking away the pain of his death, it is comforting to his family and friends.
