Rob will be lovingly remembered by Jeannie, his wife of 54 years; children Brenda, Jim (Susan) and Don; Jeannie's son Rodney (Tracey) and special niece Skye; grandchildren Ben (Lindsay), Maryanna (Matt) and Leandra; great grandchildren Olivia and Sam, plus numerous other family and friends.

Rob was born in Toronto April 14, 1931 to Edwin C. and Mary and received his Masters of Arts degree in Geology from the University of Toronto in 1962. While attending university he served with the Royal Canadian auxiliary and was a Vampire jet pilot with 411 Squadron. He retained a private pilot licence since 1954 and owned many single engine airplanes. Rob started his career at the Nepheline quarry near Peterborough, was hired by Ontario Department of Mines specializing in Industrial minerals in Toronto, and by 1969 he held the position of Chief Resident Geologist for Southern Ontario. Eventually he moved into the private sector and was on the Securities Commission as an Industrial minerals expert. The UN sent him to Yemen and Russia in this capacity. Rob wrote numerous geological publications over his life time.
